## MATURE AGERS FILL STATE COMBINE INVITES

AFL CLUBS have turned to mature-age players when deciding their state combine invitations, particularly in relation to the South Australian combine. A total of 11 players invited are not in their top-age year this year, including nine of whom were born prior to the twenty-first century.

Among the South Australian invitees are Glenelg's Luke Partington. The former Eagle was delisted last season after two years at AFL level, but did all he could at SANFL level, putting together a consistent season for the Tigers, eventually winning a premiership to accompany his Margarey Medal.

Partington's season earned him a State Draft Combine invitation, and he did not

waste any time in performing at the combine clocking a 2.870-second 20-metre sprint, an 8.150-second agility test and a 21.2yo-yo test.

In contrast to Partington, Adelaide SANFL player Jy Farrar only managed the two games in the competition this year, but dominated the athletic tests with a 2.9-second 20-metre sprint, 8.180-second agility test and an 81cm running vertical leap.

Crows' teammate Tom Hutchesson was just as impressive, with the fastest agility time of 7.870 and the equal third fastest 20-metre sprint of 2.900 seconds.

In terms of the top-age players, Harrison Magor impressed with an 80cm running

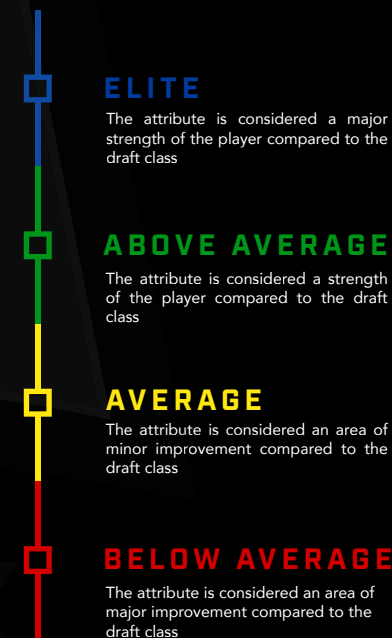
vertical leap, a 2.840-second 20-metre sprint - ranked first overall at the combine - and an 8.130-agility test. Anzac Lochowiak leaped high to record a 91cm running vertical leap and 73cm standing vertical leap - only beaten by his older brother, Mihail.

While there is plenty of top-age talent to identify in South Australia, it was clear that clubs are also keeping a watch on mature-age talent given the success of mid-season draft recruits Will Snelling and John Noble, who came straight out of the SANFL to play a role in Essendon and Collingwood's AFL seasons. Even more so, the success of Marlion Pickett in Richmond's premiership win gave an extra boost to those clubs considering taking a punt on previously overlooked players.

## ROWELL THE TOP AFL FANTASY PICK

IT is not very often that the top overall pick in the National AFL Draft is the clear choice when it comes to those AFL fans already looking ahead to 2020 AFL Fantasy or SuperCoach sides. Rowell had a magnificent season in 2019, averaging 132.1 AFL Fantasy points in seven games in the NAB League, almost seven more than his closest rival - Gold Coast SUNS Academy member, Connor Budarick.

Number two selection, Noah Anderson was the equal-second highest Victorian, averaging 111.6 points per game along with Sandringham Dragons' Darcy Chirgwin. # DÉJÀ VU AS WA UNDER 18S CLINCH NATIONAL TITLE

IT was a case of déjà vu for Western Australia as the same group that beat Country to the National Championship title at Under-16 level with the last kick of the game did exactly the same two years later, winning a thriller by five points.

A Regan Clarke set shot just before the siren cancelled out Ned Cahill's soccer goal to pinch the lead, with absolute scenes ensuing at Marvel Stadium after what was a rather slow first three quarters.

The visitors started brightly, bossing general play with the ball locked into their forward half and Country unable to create any form of rebound. Arguably the standout of the opening term, Jeremy Sharp started the scoring as he held onto a neat Elijah Taylor pass across the arc and kicked truly, with Callum Jamieson snaring WA's second as he snatched the ball from Isaac Wareham and dribbled home. Jai Jackson compounded a dominant first 15 minutes with his own set shot conversion. An injury to Riley Garcia as he fell awkwardly in a marking contest soured the look of the scoreboard, with the Sandgropers breaking to an even three-goal lead. Cahill missed a cut-edge opportunity late in the piece with time added on, opting for a shot with teammates screaming for it inside 50.

The second term started with much of the same, but WA's Jamieson, Nathan O'Driscoll, and Sharp all missed set shot chances in the first seven minutes. The visitors just seemed to have greater numbers around the ball, with the likes of Liam Henry spreading best to get them moving forward. Meanwhile, Country lacked fluency in all areas as they struggled again to get the ball moving out of defence – as even the likes of Hayden Young and Lachlan Ash found themselves turning the ball over by foot. Logan McDonald snapped the streak of behinds at the fourth and fifth time of asking for WA, slotting a set shot and soccering off the ground to compile the misery for Country. Ned Cahill finally broke through for the home side's first goal, earning a free kick at the bottom of the pack and making amends for his earlier miss. The struggle continued for them though as they got forward to no avail, with WA's spare behind the ball proving more than handy as they led by 25 points at the main break.



A typically shrewd Cody Weightman snap early in the third term made it unlikely back-to-back goals for Country for the first time in the game. Their small momentum shift was quelled relatively quickly though as Tyrone Thorne dribbled home a nice goal, with deadlock again setting in shortly after. Ash comprehensively burst that bubble with a highlight reel run through the middle and booming kick inside 50 to Brodie Kemp, who duly sent another through the big sticks, and the big-bodied Pioneer backed it up with another mark and goal to cut the margin to 11 points heading into the final break.

A Nicholas Martin overhead grab backing back in the forward pocket was the first highlight of the fourth term, and he cut inboard to find Sharp in worlds of space. The East Fremantle player would go on to miss the resultant shot, but Riley Baldi could not quite make him pay up the other end – missing from close-range after a 50-metre penalty and Country forward-half possession. Another 50-metre penalty gave Charlie Comben the opportunity to cut the margin to just five points after he marked well in front of Luke Jackson, and he delivered with 10 minutes remaining. Caleb Serong almost put his side in front but saw his shot touched on the line, but Kemp again looked to be the saviour with a big clunk deep in the pocket – only to hit the post with the shot. Henry popped back up with two chances to stick the dagger in Country's heart but missed both with just five minutes on the clock. Ned Cahill had no such worries with an opportunistic soccer-goal from the goalsquare to momentarily pinch the lead. A lunging Serong tackle looked a game-winner

# DRAFT DREAM REMAINS ALIVE FOR ROOKIE ME COMBINE INVITEES

TWENTY-ONE draft hopefuls tested themselves in front of AFL recruiters at Melbourne's State Netball and Hockey Centre last month to potentially elevate themselves into draft contention.

Having the opportunity to test alongside the State Draft Combine invitees, the Rookie Me Combine invitees were able to compete against those athletes who received multiple AFL club combine invitations. Among the names who have put in consistent seasons are mid-forwards, Murray Bushrangers' Jye Chalcraft and GWV Rebels' Mitch Martin, as well as ruck options, Eastern Ranges' Riley Smith, Sandringham Dragons' Jesse Castan and Bendigo Pioneers' Aaron Gundry. In terms of key position players, bottom-age best and fairest winner, Sandringham's Corey Watts tested, as did Bushrangers' tall Liam Fiore and Tasmanian utility, Jake Steele.

Looking at the top results, Fiore and Western Jets' Daly Andrews tested strongly in the vertical jumps, Werribee mature-ager Bior Malual was lightning in the agility test and the last player standing in the yo-yo test, while the likes of Tasmania's Jared Dakin and Sydney Swans Academy member Luke Parks clocked sub-three seconds in the 20m sprint. Sandringham Dragons' Harry Loughnan was arguably the top tester across all tests, recording an 80cm running vertical jump, 2.96-second 20m sprint, 8.22-second agility test and 21.3 yo-yo test.

From last year's Rookie Me Draft Combine, Western Bulldogs' Ben Cavarra and Adelaide's Jordan Butts were selected in the AFL National and Rookie Drafts respectively. However, in the pre-season and mid-season drafts, Casey Demons' Jay Lockhart (Melbourne), Sandringham's Hayden McLean and Eastern's Cody Hirst (both Sydney) were drafted after missing out last year.

The Rookie Me Combine was held in conjunction with the State Combine on Saturday, October 5.

# BRAZILL JUGGLES CODES

**COLLINGWOOD Magpies dual athlete and fan favourite, Ash Brazill continues to take the netball world by storm. At 175cm tall, the 29-year-old wing defence is one of the most dynamic midcourt defenders in Suncorp Super Netball, with a will to take the game on and the speed to match it.**

Brazill had an impressive 2018, averaging two intercepts and three deflections per game, showcasing her ability to read the play and fly for possession while also preventing attackers from feeding into the circle.

For Brazill, the 2019 season is sure to be a game-changer in Australian netball, with a flurry of changes coming to every team during the off-season. Teams had an opportunity to show off their new and improved line-ups in the round-robin preseason tournament, Suncorp #TeamGirls Cup in early March, with the Magpies coming out on top credit to their communication and speed across the court.

Coming off the back of a strong preseason, Brazill said she was excited about the season ahead, given the improvement seen in the side since first coming together as a team. The Magpies outran the Melbourne Vixens for preseason glory, beating their Victorian rivals for the first time since the team's inception in 2017, and setting themselves up to be one of the teams to watch in 2019.

"Everyone thinks that Collingwood and Vixens hate each other, but Vixens are my second favourite team! I really like the Vixens because they're just great netballers, their coach is amazing, the way they play the game is basic simple netball," Brazill said. "You know what they're going to do, but they do it so well that you can't stop them."

"They're going to be our measure, I think. "I'm not sure when we play them - I think it's Round 6 or Round 7 - but it will be at that point where if we can beat them, we know we'll be in a good place."

Rob Wright has stepped up into the role of Head Coach in 2019, and Brazill said his impact has been a



game changer for the whole team with his take on the game and ability to read patterns of play different to any other coach she has had in the past.

"It's his first year as Head Coach and already I've learnt so much from him," Brazill said. "I think the last couple of years we've really over-thought it, where Rob's just all about the basics and getting it right. If we can do our basics better than the other team then we're going to be winning."

"The way that he sees the game is so different to anyone else. He can tell you what patterns certain players do when you're coming up against them - you're just like 'whatever' and then you play them and they do it again and again and again, and you're like how do you know this, you're a weirdo!" Brazill said.

"Rob knows his strengths and he's brought in people that can really help where his weaknesses are and he lets them coach. "A lot of coaches do their thing and assistant coaches kind of come in here and there - but

they all have their own block of training so it's been really good, we get a mix of the three of them. He's definitely the best coach I've ever had, and I think a lot of people in our team would be saying the same thing."

The Magpies were touted to have an "All-Star" line-up over the past few years, with the likes of Australian Diamonds, Sharni Layton, Kim Ravaillon, Caitlin Thwaites, April Brandley and Madi Browne taking the court in the black and white. However, the side continued to come under fire, unable to finish games with a full four quarter effort and not getting the reward for their intensity on court.

"It's not just the players that have changed, but we have a completely new coaching staff... you don't normally have that much turnaround in two years, but I think it's something we definitely needed," Brazill said. "We have an amazing group this year. Lineup wise we definitely have great players, and the gel and connection that we have at the moment we haven't had in the last two seasons so I'm really hoping that, that can take

us somewhere."

With the retirement of Layton, Erin Bell and Shae Brown at the end of 2018, the side had a complete overhaul, picking up a variety of All-Star recruits. Sunshine Coast Lightning premiership players, Geva Mentor and Kelsey Browne have returned to Victoria, while Nat Medhurst and Shimona Nelson will take the court in goals with elevated Tasmanian Magpies shooter, Gabby Sinclair.

"It's like we've been together for years, everyone's really good friends. I've never been in a team with Geva, Kelsey... Nat I was with Fever, Shimona - no, and then Gabby Sinclair is one of our young kids coming through, so a lot of us haven't played together before," Brazill said. "But we're all so close, we hang out outside of netball and it's not forced, so it's a really cool little group."
